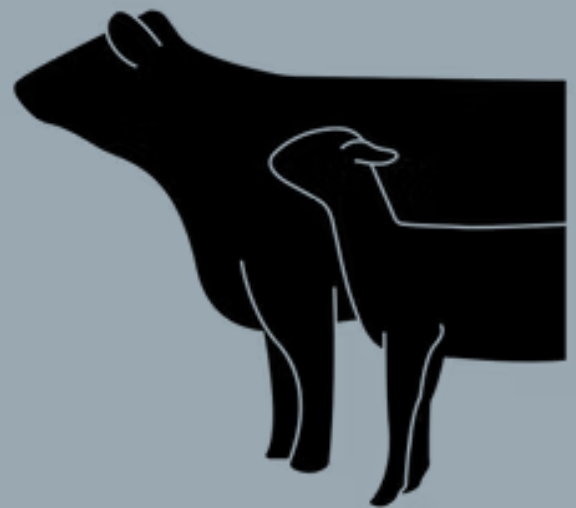

You are invited to meet the members and preview the Steer & Lamb Sale. This is a family friendly event that showcases the hard work and dedication of our 4-H members. Please plan to join us as our 4-H families are excited to share this experience with the community.

About the Event

Achievement Day is the highlight of the 4-H year for the Millarville Stockland 4-H Club. After months of hard work raising and caring for their project animals, members come together to showcase what they have learned throughout the year.

During the day, members exhibit their livestock projects in showmanship and conformation classes, demonstrating their skills in animal care, preparation, and handling. Projects include market steers, breeding females, market lambs, and breeding sheep. Members are evaluated on both their animals and their knowledge, while judges provide valuable feedback to help them continue to grow.

Achievement Day is also a fun, family-friendly event where our community can see the results of the members' dedication. It offers a chance to meet the young agriculturalists behind the projects and preview the animals before the annual 4-H Steer and Lamb Sale.

Most importantly, Achievement Day celebrates the effort, learning, and personal growth that members experience throughout the 4-H year.



How does a 4-H member come up with their price?

Typically 4-H members research current market prices, as well as retail grocery store prices. They usually consult with a mentor, which could be a parent, a producer they look up to, or their 4-H leader. Using these factors, they calculate a price on their home-raised beef or lamb that is a fair premium for the quality meat they have raised.

What else does 4-H promote?

The 4-H program is designed to foster confidence, competency, and hands-on skill development in youth. The 4-H members must keep detailed records on the feeding & health of their project(s), participate in public speaking & community volunteer initiatives each year.

What goes into raising 4-H beef and lamb?

The 4-H program promotes the “learn to do by doing” mindset in youngsters. The process of selecting, caring for, & raising these animals to the best of their ability is the sole job of the 4-H youth, who range in age from 9 - 21 years. Through mentors they discover what cattle/sheep like to eat & what makes their animal most comfortable (large pen size, clean bedding, feed variety are examples) & how to train these animals to follow a lead, have a bath & learn to accept pets & scratches from their human caretakers. Raising a 4-H project animal is hard work! 4-H members start a market beef project in October & a market lamb project in March & typically finish in May or June.

Why Buy Beef in Bulk???

A Market Steer that weighs 1300 lbs will have an average yield of 62%. After processing and de-boning, approximately 637 pounds of meat will be wrapped for consumption. You will end up with the following:

395 lbs of Roasts & Steaks & 240 lbs of Ground Beef & Stewing Beef.

To go to the grocery store and buy this today, you'll pay:

395 lbs of Roasts & Steaks at an avg price of \$21.78/lb = \$8,603.10

240 lbs of Ground & Stewing Beef at an avg price of \$14.20/lb = \$3,408.00

Approximate cost to purchase in store \$12,011.10

Price of a steer at your local 4-H sale \$6.00/lb x 1300lbs = \$7,800.00

Price of butcher, cutting and wrapping approx. \$1,200.00

How to participate in the DLMS Farm Gate Timed Auction with extended bidding???

1. Visit www.dlms.ca, scroll down sale list to find the sale you are interested in bidding on. Click on the sale listing & you will be taken to the Farm Gate Timed Auction Sale page.
2. After you are at the Farm Gate Timed auction site - farmgatetimedauctions.ca, click the LOGIN/REGISTRATION button.

First time Farm Gate users:

- First time users will select the REGISTER button from this page. Fill out the registration form to sign up for a free user account & it allows you to select a username & password for use on all Farm Gate Timed auctions. (please note due to some of the text notification features the Farm Gate Time Auction Site requires a new & separate account from your DLMS Live sale site)
- After you create your Farm Gate account you will receive a txt message with a pin code to verify your account.
- On your first log-in to Farm Gate Timed auctions we recommend you go to your profile & confirm your notifications are set to YES. This allows the site to send you text &/or email notifications when you are out bid & if there is activity on your favorite lots.

Returning Farm Gate users:

- If you have used Farm Gate Timed auctions in the past simply enter your username & password to continue. After you have logged in you are able to browse the timed auctions on DLMS Farm Gate Timed Auctions.

3. How to Bid

Now that you are logged in & your account phone number / email is verified you can bid on an upcoming sale. Simply find the lot you are interested in bidding on. After you have found the lot there are 2 options for bidding on the lot.

- **Place Next Bid** – to place the next bid on the item, you see the amount in the first box, you simply click the “Place Bid” button & after you review the bid & agree to the terms & conditions your bid will be placed.

- **Max Bid Amount** – to place a max bid you put your max bid in the second box listed as “Max Bid” on the item, & then click the “Place Bid” button & after you review the bid & agree to the terms & conditions your bid will be placed as the next bid. With the Max Bid placed the computer will then keep you as the high bidder to the max amount you have placed. This is helpful if you are not able to give 100% attention to the sale close out & protect your interest, so you do not miss out on any lots you want to purchase. The Max Bid amount is completely confidential from the seller during the sale process.

Example of How the Max Bid Works - If the lot has a \$3.00/lb bid on it & you place a proxy bid of \$5.00/lb into the system, the computer will bid \$3.25/lb for you but if some one else bids \$3.50/lb, the computer will again bid for you, this time at \$3.75/lb. The system will look after your interest to a maximum of \$5.00/lb. If another bidder is on at \$5.00/lb, your proxy will no longer be effective, & you will no longer have the winning bid on this lot without once again logging in & bidding again or moving your attention to a second lot of interest. Please note that in some cases a lot value can change very quickly if 2 max bids are placed on the same lot competing against each other.

4. Watch List Feature

If you have items in multiple auctions or only a few from the same auction that you want to watch with out having to scroll through the entire list, you can add the lots to your watchlist. On each lot you will see the “eye” button beside the bid button, by clicking this “watchlist” Icon that item is added to your personal watchlist for easy viewing of just your favorite lots in this sale or on the entire site.

5. Sale Ending / Closeout

The Millarville Stockland 4-H Sale Timed Auction sales close racehorse style with extended bidding.

What is Racehorse Style Close?

Racehorse style sale close is when the entire sale stays open in extended bidding. This type of sale allows you as the bidder to change to a different lot within the same sale if the bidding has gone in to extended bidding.

How will Extended Bidding works?

When we get to the close out end time the clock for close extends with any bid placed with less than 5 min on the clock. This type of extended bidding turns the end time to more of a soft time. Extended bidding allows bidders to compete like a real auction & give all bidders the same time to make a decision. Always follow the clock to see how much time remains in the lots you are interested in.

6. Bidding Close & Follow-up

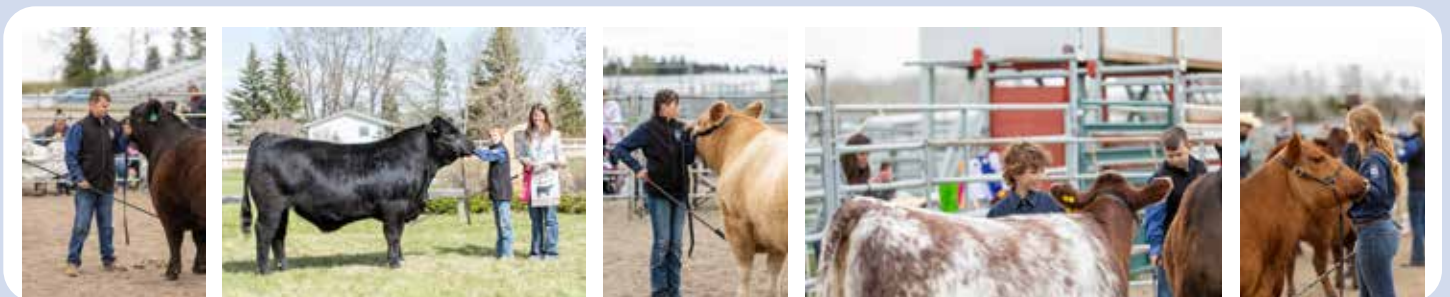
After the clock has gone to “ENDED” & no bidding has occurred for 5 min the computer will declare the sale finished. Following the close typically within 24 hours of the sale close the sale consignor will contact all winning bidders to arrange payment.

Please make sure that your account info is up-to-date & correct if you are the winning bidder of a lot as this is how the billing is sent to Sale manager &/or Sale consignor.

Terms of Sale

- * Millarville Stockland 4-H Club Sale will take place Thursday, June 4th, 2026. The timed auction will run 12:00pm - 6:00pm.
- * The auction will be a racehorse finish, please see bidding instructions on page 30 of the catalog.
- * Animals will be sold per pound based on an official weight.
- * Steers will be weighed on May 28, 2026 and will be sold without shrink. The steers are on feed a minimum of 226 days.
- * Our steer butcher dates are for the week of June 15, 2026, the steers will stay on feed for more than 2 weeks after their official weigh-in, this is why the members decided to sell without shrink.
- * Sheep will be weighed on June 1st and will be sold without shrink.
- * Our Sheep Leader will be in contact regarding butcher dates.
- * Settlement will be made directly to each 4-H member (e-transfer is preferred).
- * At the completion of the auction, each 4-H member will be in contact with the buyer to arrange for payment and issue receipts.
- * Payment must be made within 48 hours of close of sale.
- * Payment must be made in full to the 4-H member before the animal can be delivered to the processor.
- * All animals have a guaranteed abattoir spot. Steers have booked spots with Pure Country Meats.
- * Alternate processing locations must be arranged by buyer. Delivery to alternate processors may be possible with prior arrangement.
- * Delivery to butcher is the responsibility of the 4-H member at no cost to the purchaser.
- * The purchaser and 4-H member will reach an agreement about delivery of the boxed product to the buyer.
- * The purchaser of the animal(s) is responsible for the processing fees.
